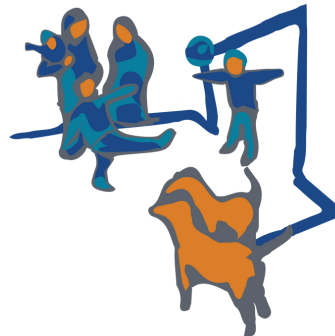
Jesuit Support to the Ukraine Crisis

**ANNUAL REPORT**

The International Armed Conflict in Ukraine has caused the largest humanitarian crisis in Europe in recent history. Millions have been forced to flee their homes, and millions more remain displaced or in need in Ukraine. Upon the outbreak of this conflict, the **Society of Jesus** coordinated a global response through JRS and Xavier Network in Ukraine, neighboring countries, and the rest of Europe to welcome, protect, promote, and integrate those in need.

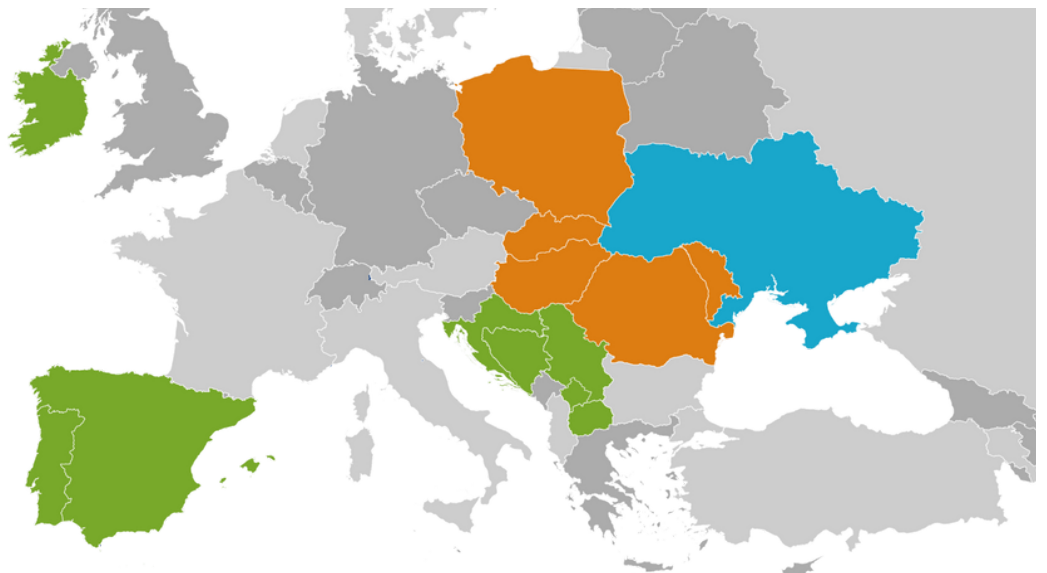

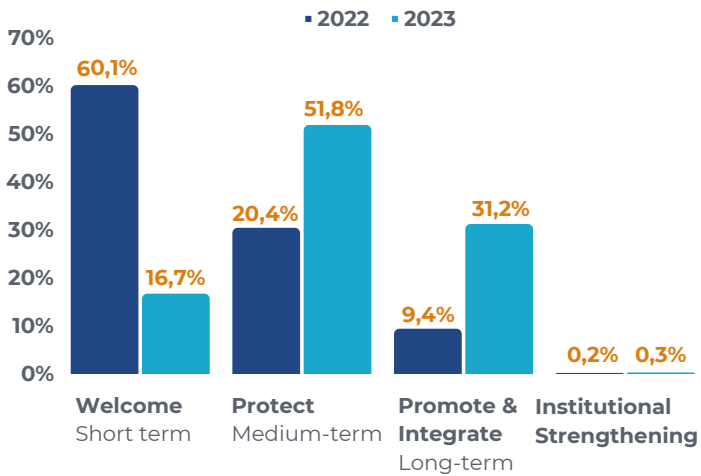

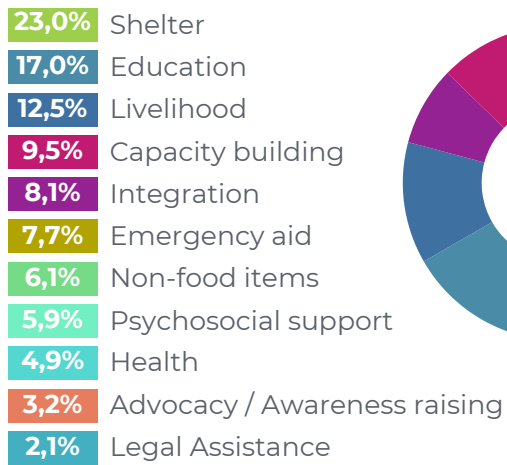


# Activities overview
