

Financing mobility for rejected asylum seekers in Switzerland

- + It is an effective remedy against the administrative organized isolation.
- + It fosters effectively the empowerment of the de facto disempowered refugees.
- But: For about 80 people it exceeds the annual budget.
- But: It changes the quality of relationships between volunteers/activists and beneficiaries.
- This kind of support need a holistic accompaniment with every single person.



Involve rejected asylum seekers as volunteers in JRS Switzerland projects

- Engaging refugees helps them finding their own dignity of being able to contribute.
- Their precarious and uncertain situation prevents them from a stable commitment.
- Where stable commitment is the condition of a good collaboration, strong accompaniment is required.
